Shoes in Zarzalito

The mother looked sad; the child appeared depressed. The mother seemed frightened; the little girl had no affect. They presented a whole different appearance from the usually excited and upbeat crowd that visited the clinic as if it were a major social event. Neither seemed sick, but something was clearly wrong.

We were in Zarzalito, about a two hour trip from Esquipulas. Considering the poverty and lack of appropriate space, the village organizers had done a good job. There was a steady flow of patients and people had the usual mix of bronchitis, infections, rashes, amentia and parasites. But the 10 year old girl was a different story.

Her mother explained to the doctor that her daughter didn't want to go to school, cried easily, and had no friends. She claimed that the other children made fun of her and she could not play their games. Further questions led to the fact that the little girl had been born without toes and therefore, could not wear flip flops, the standard footwear of all children. She had a pair of shoes that were much too small and had to shuffle along to keep them on her feet. The mother insisted she wear them to protect her from parasites, but one way or the other, the children laughed at her daughter.

The solution appeared so simple. Buy her a new pair of shoes. However, the distance, the difficulty of transportation, the cost of the trip, plus the shoes, made that impossible. The doctor told the mother she was doing a good job with her daughter and that we could possibly help. Then she asked for a cell phone number. The mother didn't have one, but a neighbor did, and we left with that.

Back in Esquipulas, the search for shoes began. Two team members located a pair that would fit the child, plus another pair two sizes larger. Then the issue of getting them to the family. They located a driver for Sunday, who happened to have a grandmother in Zarzalito, and called the mom to say they would meet at the clinic site on Sunday. And so it went.

When the little girl saw the shoes, she burst into tears, but this time tears of joy. She put on the shoes and ran down the hill, then up again. The mother too began to weep, along with the team members. The cost of the shoes had been \$3.00 a pair.

Dear Parish of St. Joachim – St John; I send my most sincere thanks and appreciation for the amazing generosity of parishioners when I came to Masses to speak about Marist's Campus Ministry's Global Outreach to Mérida, Mexico. We left Marist on March 10 and arrived to Mérida around mid afternoon and were warmly greeted by the community who were just finishing celebrating mass. We were given four projects: We worked on a chicken coup, a floor soccer field, a Rabbit Hatch, and four-compartment recycling containers. The particular project I participated in was working on turning what used to be a basketball court, into a small floor soccer field. Our team started this project by collecting rocks from around the outside area to create a supportive structure to hold the concrete which we were also mixing by hand, or shovel. The project was definitely tiresome and made our muscles ache, carrying buckets of concrete to pour or slap on with a technique that looked much easier than it actually was, to make the wall's structure. This said, the man in charge and the construction person would come to work every day with the most positive smile.

This short, older man would carry or lift the concrete with no problem. He amazed us with what a hard worker he was, and we could not believe how he never took a break. He was fully capable of doing the entire project by himself, which we knew, but it definitely helped a lot that he did not have to do it alone. We were able to give him the few extra hands to do one side of the wall while he did the other, to make the process quicker than if he were doing it alone. The last night we were there, we were able to play a soccer game against the local boys of the community which was so great to see how the project we worked on would be enjoyed by the kids of the community. On our last day, we also walked a couple of blocks from the community center to an area called "invasion," which is a place where people fleeing from other parts of the continent come for refuge. This was extremely eye opening because there were hundreds of families living in shacks or structures made from remnants found and taped together. We went to hand out basic essentials such as soap, toothpaste, baby wipes and tooth brushes. The Marist brothers wanted us to see who our projects would be ultimately affecting. The rabbit hatch and chicken coups' purpose is for the community center to eventually be able to host a dinner for the poor families. Without the generosity of your parish, we would not have been able to complete these projects. Evangelio: Jn 14, 1-12

Reflexión***“Yo soy el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida.******Nadie va al Padre sino por mí”***

Hoy, la escena que contemplamos en el Evangelio nos pone ante la intimidad que existe entre Jesucristo y el Padre; pero no sólo eso, sino que también nos invita a descubrir la relación entre Jesús y sus discípulos. «Y cuando haya ido y os haya preparado un lugar, volveré y os tomaré conmigo, para que donde esté yo estéis también vosotros» (Jn 14,3): estas palabras de Jesús, no sólo sitúan a los discípulos en una perspectiva de futuro, sino que los invita a mantenerse fieles al seguimiento que habían emprendido. Para compartir con el Señor la vida gloriosa, han de compartir también el mismo camino que lleva a Jesucristo a las moradas del Padre.

«Señor, no sabemos a dónde vas, ¿cómo podemos saber el camino?» (Jn 14,5). Le dice Jesús: «Yo soy el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida. Nadie va al Padre sino por mí. Si me conocéis a mí, conoceréis también a mi Padre; desde ahora lo conocéis y lo habéis visto» (Jn 14,6-7). Jesús no propone un camino simple, ciertamente; pero nos marca el sendero. Es más, Él mismo se hace Camino al Padre; Él mismo, con su resurrección, se hace Caminante para guiarnos; Él mismo, con el don del Espíritu Santo nos alienta y fortalece para no desfallecer en el peregrinar: «No se turbe vuestro corazón» (Jn 14,1).

En esta invitación que Jesús nos hace, la de ir al Padre por Él, con Él y en Él, se revela su deseo más íntimo y su más profunda misión: «El que por nosotros se hizo hombre, siendo el Hijo único, quiere hacernos hermanos suyos y, para ello, hace llegar hasta el Padre verdadero su propia humanidad, llevando en ella consigo a todos los de su misma raza» (San Gregorio de Nisa).
