**Reflection**  
**By Fr. Wency**  
**Dignity and Decorum**

A couple of days ago, one of our parishioners asked me, "Father, why can't some people come to Church properly dressed when they go to some restaurants, weddings and funerals well-dressed? Then jokingly I said, quoting from Luke 12:14, in Jesus' words, 'Man, who appointed me a judge or an arbiter between you?' His question evoked some reflection. There are no official and specific Church norms or requirements for lay people mentioned in the Canon Law. There is very little in Scriptures that seems to spell out the proper way to dress for sacred worship. There is the general directive to Adore the Lord in holy attire (Psalm 96:9; Ps. 29:2).

Hence it seems that culture supplies most of the norms regarding what is considered appropriate attire for Church. Nonetheless, we have become extremely casual about the way we dress for just about everything. It seems we almost never dress up anymore. Sneakers or tennis shoes as we called them for sports or running and walking around. But we would never even think of wearing them to school and certainly not to Church. I remember having a pair of shoes just for Church. It was also expected that I would go to Church in formal, pressed trousers, and a button down shirt,

Well, as summer is upon us the tendency is just wear anything. Who cares? This attitude leads us just to forget where we are going! Our attire reveals who we are! Clothes say something about what we think, what we value. They also influence how we behave and feel. That our culture has become so casual about everything says something about us. It is said, 'everything is important and nothing is really all that important.' But that is not true, Going to God's house IS important. Being in the presence of "Holy of Holies" (tabernacle) is awesome. Casual attire in these circumstances is simply inappropriate if we really think about what we are doing. Where we are going and who it is we all meet. It does not mean that we must wear tuxedos and formal gowns. But decent formal attire seems to be appropriate. Sunday is special. God's House is special. Some things really ARE important and our clothing and demeanor ought to reflect the truth.

Modesty is an orientation of the heart and mind, first and foremost. It begins with putting God first. Sacrifice is something like 'cliché' in our faith. There was a time when our ancestors diligently and seriously followed their faith externally and internally—fasting overnight before they received

the Holy Eucharist the next day, dressed modestly, participated in worship regularly. We are the generations that followed. What legacy we are passing to succeeding generations? Jesus, Our Savior says, 'You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden.'(Mat. 5:14). Let our actions speak louder than words. May God bless us with discernment of heart and mind.

**HIS WORD TODAY** by Rev. William J. Reilly

### **Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time June 25, 2017**

**“But the gift is not like the transgression. For if by the transgression of the one, many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many.”... “For to you I have entrusted my cause. Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord for he has rescued the life of the poor.”**

We receive many gifts, and in our own day use the word ‘regift’ to pass on to someone else a gift we have received because we do not need it or like it. Some of our greatest gifts we take for granted. Consider for a moment the gift of life, of health, of family, of friends. All are important and treasured and are not for giving away.

St. Paul told the Romans of the gift of Jesus, rescuing us with the gift of grace which overflows, the gift of life in abundance. Remember the floods which hit the rivers in California and Texas last winter. Remember the devastation of hurricane Matthew in Haiti last fall. The overflow was devastating. The grace of God, offering us the abundant life, has been poured out into our hearts. He sends and we receive, but like any gift we have to reach out, open our hands and hearts to receive it. Yes, Lord, to you I have entrusted my cause.

**Domingo XII Del Tiempo Ordinario****LECTURAS:****1ª Lectura:** Jer 20, 10-13 **2ª Lectura:** Rom 5, 12-15**Evangelio:** Mt 10, 26-33**Reflexión****«No temáis a los que matan el cuerpo»**

Hoy, después de elegir a los doce, Jesús los envía a predicar y los instruye. Les advierte acerca de la persecución que posiblemente sufrirán y les aconseja cuál debe ser su actitud: «No temáis a los que matan el cuerpo, pero no pueden matar el alma; temed más bien a aquel que puede llevar a la perdición alma y cuerpo en la gehenna» (Mt 10,28). El relato de este domingo desarrolla el tema de la persecución por Cristo con un estilo que recuerda la última Bienaventuranza del Sermón de la Montaña (cf. Mt 5,11).

El discurso de Jesús es paradójico: por un lado dice dos veces “no temáis”, y nos presenta un Padre providente que tiene solicitud incluso por los pajarillos del campo; pero por otra parte, no nos dice que este Padre nos ahorre las contrariedades, más bien lo contrario: si somos seguidores suyos, muy posiblemente tendremos la misma suerte que Él y los demás profetas. ¿Cómo entender esto, pues? La protección de Dios es su capacidad de dar vida a nuestra persona (nuestra alma), y proporcionarle felicidad incluso en las tribulaciones y persecuciones. Él es quien puede darnos la alegría de su Reino que proviene de una vida profunda, experimentable ya ahora y que es prenda de vida eterna: «Por todo aquel que se declare por mí ante los hombres, yo también me declararé por él ante mi Padre que está en los cielos» (Mt 10,32).

Confiar en que Dios estará junto a nosotros en los momentos difíciles nos da valentía para anunciar las palabras de Jesús a plena luz, y nos da la energía capaz de obrar el bien, para que por medio de nuestras obras la gente pueda dar gloria al Padre celestial. Nos enseña san Anselmo: «Hacedlo todo por Dios y por aquella feliz y eterna vida que nuestro Salvador se digna concederos en el cielo».
