Reflection

by Sister Marjorie of the Eucharist, OCD

July holds fond memories for me. I am invited to reflect on the ideals that shaped our nation and our life commitments, and on the extraordinary Gift of the Eucharist.

In 1776 the ideals expressed so eloquently in the Declaration of Independence inspired 13 colonies to unite. The United States has defended those ideals on battlefields at home and abroad throughout its 241-year history.

The Bicentennial of the nation's birth was an exciting time in July of 1976. What held equal significance for me that summer was the 41st International Eucharistic Congress in Philadelphia. The theme, *Jesus, the Bread of Life*, invited participants from around the world to celebrate the gift of God's love in the Eucharist.

I reflect not only on the ideals that formed our country and on the gift of the Eucharist. I am reminded of the promises we make to God and to one another throughout our lives. I was privileged to profess solemn vows in July 1976, promising God to live the Gospel ideals of religious profession through vows of obedience, poverty, chastity.

Ideals call forth the best in us and challenge us when we fall short. The promises we make speak of something greater than us. Without God's grace we can easily lose sight of the goal, overlooking the gifts we have been given as a Church, as a nation and as individuals.

Anniversaries are occasions to remember the ideals that have formed us. We pause to rejoice in God's mercy and to anticipate the future with hope. *Forever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.* (Responsorial Psalm). Be it our defining document as a nation, vows of marriage or religious profession, priestly ordination, promises made to friends and family, God's gift of the Eucharist sustains us as we strive to live out our ideals, drawing us into relationship with God, filling our hungry hearts with the Bread of Life. Jesus promised: "Know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time."

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly
Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
July 2, 2017

"Whoever receives you receives me and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me... And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because this little one is a disciple, amen, I say to you he will surely not lose his reward."

One of the gifts Pope Francis extols, is the gift of hospitality. In our families, in our church, we have the ability to open the door and make others feel welcome. A familiar Irish expression reads "A Hundred Thousand Welcome."

Elisha the prophet in the Book of Kings, was offered hospitality by a wealthy woman, and she was rewarded for her gift. The person ready and willing to give ONLY a cup of cold water in the name of Jesus to a little one will not go without a reward.

In the past it was not common to see people carrying a water bottle in public. Sometimes we looked for a fountain for a drink. Maybe the gift of water and hospitality for us can be welcoming a stranger, assisting someone in need, listening to a person who has suffered a loss or suffering a sickness. Whatever gesture I offer can be the Elisha gesture and the water offering which might seem small, but does not go unrewarded.

REFLEXIÓN

El que no toma su cruz y me sigue detrás no es digno de mí. Quien a vosotros recibe, a mí me recibe.
Hoy, al escuchar de boca de Jesús: «El que ama a su padre o a su madre más que a mí, no es digno de mí...» (Mt 10,37) quedamos desconcertados. Ahora bien, al profundizar un poco más, nos damos cuenta de la lección que el Señor quiere transmitirnos: para el cristiano, el único absoluto es Dios y su Reino. Cada cual debe descubrir su vocación —posiblemente esta es la tarea más delicada de todas— y seguirla fielmente. Si un cristiano o cristiana tienen vocación matrimonial, deben ver que llevar a cabo su vocación consiste en amar a su familia tal como Cristo ama a la Iglesia.

La vocación a la vida religiosa o al sacerdocio pide no anteponer los vínculos familiares a los de la fe, si con ello no faltamos a los requisitos básicos de la caridad cristiana. Los vínculos familiares no pueden esclavizar y ahogar la vocación a la que somos llamados. Detrás de la palabra “amor” puede esconderse un deseo posesivo del otro que le quita libertad para desarrollar su vida humana y cristiana; o el miedo a salir del nido familiar y enfrentarse a las exigencias de la vida y de la llamada de Jesús a seguirlo. Es esta deformación del amor la que Jesús nos pide transformar en un amor gratuito y generoso, porque, como dice san Agustín: «Cristo ha venido a transformar el amor».

El amor y la acogida siempre serán el núcleo de la vida cristiana, hacia todos y, sobre todo, hacia los miembros de nuestra familia, porque habitualmente son los más cercanos y constituyen también el “prójimo” que Jesús nos pide amar. En la acogida a los demás está siempre la acogida a Cristo: «Quien a vosotros recibe, a mí me recibe» (Mt 11,40). Debemos ver, pues, a Cristo en aquellos a quien servimos, y reconocer igualmente a Cristo servidor en quienes nos sirven.
